



Undaunted by fire, Concours Week promises beauty, luxury and fun

■OR NEARLY seven decades, automotive events have been part of the Monterey Peninsula's landscape, as a road race through the forest of Pebble Beach and an accompanying casual car show have expanded to include a multitude of events for fans of every type of automobile, whether collectible and rare, fast and furious, sleek and modern, or clunky and eccen-

While 2015 had some one-off events that won't be repeated this year, 2016 promises even more sparkle, with a few milestones and over-the-top events.

Below, The Pine Cone details everything the Monterey Peninsula has to offer as it transforms into a car-lover's paradise for anyone whose heart is set on admiring, purchasing, driving, coveting and competing in rare, exquisite and compelling automobiles — including many unique examples from the beginning of the 20th century.

The fun begins with a downtown Monterey car show Aug. 12 and ends with the one-of-a-kind Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. 



Lines between fine art and classic cars blur in BMW collection

■ VER SINCE its invention, the automobile has been celebrated as a source of ✓inspiration for artists all over the world," BMW spokesman Thomas Girst says in an introduction of his company's famous series of "art cars." Even in the early 1900s, he notes, "the car was already hailed as our sculpture of the 20th


Celebrating 100 years of automotive design and development, BMW is the headliner at many of the Monterey Peninsula's Concours Week events,


and some of its prized art cars — one-of-a-kind BMWs adorned with paint schemes and details created by some of the world's foremost artists will be on display. The car that started it all, painted by Alexander Calder in 1975, as well as the latest in the 17-car collection, painted by Jeff Koons in 2010, will be displayed at the Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion and the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance.

"I think the art cars have really helped people reconceive what BMW is — they overtly say that cars are art," said P.B. Concours spokeswoman Kandace Hawkinson. While organizers might have been able to choose which cars from the collection — which includes BMWs painted by pop artists Andy Warhol, David Hockney, Roy Lichtenstein and others — should appear at Pebble, she said they selected Calder's to please longtime fans of the artist. "And that was the first BMW art car," she said. Subsequently, the company offered to bring Koons' car, as well. "So we have the first and the last."

The series was conceived by French auctioneer and amateur racer Hervé Poulain, and he



Never mind lipstick on your collar — how about on your fender?

OTS OF people have love affairs with their cars — and our area is Exhibit A. Having a love affair with someone else's car is a little weird. Kissing it and leaving behind lipstick marks is a whole other level of crazy.

Unless it's 1959 and the car is Elvis Presley's BMW 507. The King inspired all kinds of crazy in his fans, and kissing his car or leaving messages and phone numbers in lipstick was just another manifestation of that. In fact, the problem got so bad that he had the car repainted from its original Feather White to a bright

Although lip-locking the hood is strictly verboten, the recently restored 507 will be at Pebble Beach for your viewing pleasure August 21, when it makes its Concours d'Elegance debut. It will be shown with other specially selected BMWs as part of the auto company's centennial celebration.

How the car made its way from Germany to a decrepit state in a warehouse in Northern California and then back to Germany is quite a

According to reporter Jackie Jouret, who tracked down the car for

Bimmer, (a magazine for BMW aficionados) the Army's most famous enlisted man either leased or purchased the car while stationed in Germany in 1958, and kept it until he completed his tour of duty in

Presley bought the 507 used, but it

had a more famous previous driver than most autos — Hans Stuck, a German racer who specialized in hillclimb racing (just what it sounds like, racing uphill). BMW built the car as a promotional vehicle, and Stuck was the driver who showed it off, winning several races in the

Presley was reportedly present for at least one of those races, and fell in love with the roadster. By all accounts, he enjoyed driving the car, and there are several photos of him with it. After he left Germany, however, the car's history becomes quite murky and eventually, nobody really knew where it had gotten to. Enter the tenacious

Jouret, whom The Pine Cone reached via email.

She explained what led her on her

"I'm not sure it was all that much diligence or even hunting on my part, to tell you the truth. It's my job to write about BMW history, and what better subject than the BMW owned by one of the most significant cultural figures in U.S. history, perhaps of all time?"

With the help of Dr. Karlheinz Lange, BMW expert and author of

Monterey County nonprofits fueled by P.B. Concours d'Elegance

HILE THE thousands of automobile aficionados who converge on the Monterey Peninsula for the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance may not know it, their mere presence at the event helps scores of local charities specializing in everything from educational programs for low-income children, to efforts to find homes for stray animals.

Through the Pebble Beach Company's charitable partner, the P.B. Foundation, proceeds from the Concours d'Elegance benefit nearly 100 local charities, many with a big focus on youth literacy.

"We have some serious needs around Monterey

County," Susan Merfeld, president of the Pebble Beach Company Foundation, told The Pine Cone. "Twenty-six percent of children under 17 in the county are living below the poverty level. And more than 50,000 require food assistance. Only 35 percent of our third-graders can read at grade level. These charities are really making a difference and going out and tackling those issues."

The foundation, founded in 1975 with the mission to provide young people the "building blocks of success," supports dozens of nonprofit educational programs, including the arts, athletics, environmental sciences and other programs.

In 2015, it offered a record \$850,000 in grants and scholarships.

Bill Perocchi, CEO of Pebble Beach Company, said education, especially literacy, is the central focus of the foundation.

"We believe that education is critical for individuals to rise out of poverty," Perocchi said. "The money raised for and by the foundation, and in turn distributed to our community partners, helps address this need."

Several other charities — Animal Friends Rescue Project, Boys & Girls Clubs of Monterey County, Montage Health, Kinship Center, and Natividad Medical Foundation — also benefit directly from the car event's opportunity drawings



Wanted: a different kind of driver for a different kind of tour

ICK CESPEDES' white 2002 Chevy pickup won't turn any heads this week. With its black, well worn interior and cassette player/CD combo, it's like a lot of other trucks that have been used in the trades — in his case, working as a contractor.

But there's a select group of people for whom that pickup is a welcome sight on Wednesday mornings. They're participants in Meals on Wheels of the Monterey Peninsula, headquartered at the Sally Griffin Senior Center in Pacific Grove, and Wednesday is Cespedes' day to deliver their

food — along with smiles, hugs, and a little bit of help with odds and ends.

On Wednesday, Aug. 3, I rode along as Cespedes made his rounds.

Viveca Lohr, the center's executive director, and Chris Alexander, who coordinates Meals on Wheels, said there is a great need for new drivers. There are 23 routes served five days a week by dozens of drivers, delivering meals to between 200 and 300 people daily, and demand is growing as the local population ages. Deliveries range from Marina, to the Highlands, as well as Carmel Valley.

Alexander said some people drive once a week,

some once a month, but many volunteer more often. They're short six regular drivers, which is putting a strain on their list of substitutes another option for would-be volunteers. "We can work with almost anyone's schedule," said Alexander.

So, what was it like?

A little after 9 a.m., Cespedes rolled up to the center. Drivers arrive at staggered times so there aren't 23 people milling around waiting for food. Carmel Valley drivers were the first to load up because they go the farthest. A few others waited

and grants provided through the foundation. Some of those nonprofits are:

■ Kinship Center

Kinship Center helps children find permanent families through adoption, relative caregiving or other guardianship. It also offers a variety of programs, including foster care, kinship (relative) care, mental health services for children and families, crisis support, and programs to keep children out of child welfare.

"Our commitment is to permanent rather than temporary solutions, as decades of research have shown that children need stable, permanent families in order to thrive," according to the nonprofit.

Since 1984, Kinship Center, which is headquartered in Salinas, has helped thousands of children, including those who can no longer remain safely with their birth parents because of abuse and neglect, those who have been abandoned, and those who are voluntarily relinquished for adoption as infants by their birth parents.

In 2015, the agency helped finalize more than 110 adoptions and supported hundreds of kids in foster care, while also providing therapy for many others.

The nonprofit also has facilities and services in 11 Southern California, Central Coast and Northern California counties.

■ Animal Friends Rescue Project

Since 1998, Pacific Grove-based Animal Friends Rescue Project has been finding homes for dogs and cats that don't "stand a chance of survival in the shelter," and it provides veterinary care, behavior training, and finds them permanent homes.

"These are typically shy animals, senior animals, underage or un-weaned animals, animals in need of minor and major medical attention, pregnant or nursing animals and those who have just been overlooked and been there too long," according to the nonprofit. "We work closely with the other animal welfare agencies" in Monterey, Santa Cruz and San Benito counties.

What makes AFRP different from some other animal organizations is that it does not euthanize animals that have been at the shelter too long or for medical reasons. If an adopter can no longer keep an animal, AFRP brings it back into its adop-

tion program.


The dogs and most of the cats AFRP rescues stay with foster families until they are adopted, and the nonprofit has an astonishing 400 active volunteers. And as part of its commitment to reducing the number of dogs and cats in shelters, the AFRP offers free or discounted spay and neuter vouchers for small dogs and cats.

The stories from AFRP adoptions are inspiring. Take Sancho, a 16-year-old cat that had been at the Pacific Grove adoption center for more than a year after losing his home when his owner passed away. When local resident recently Sheryl read about Sancho's story on the AFRP website, it

their turns and snacked on hot coffee, cinnamon rolls and sandwiches.

In the smallish professional kitchen, a team of mostly volunteer cooks prepared, packaged and labeled three meals for each program participant, paying attention to food allergies and nutritional issues. When Cespedes' nine deliveries were stacked on tables outside the kitchen, he put them in the bed of his truck, cold meals in tubs and hot meals — fish, on this day — in an insulated carrier.

Alexander said each participant gets a hot meal, a light dinner of salad or soup and a sandwich, some cereal or a packet of instant oatmeal, milk, juice and a piece of fruit. There's also usually some kind of dessert. She called it "24 hours of nutrition."

The program purchases some food and relies on donations for the rest. Alexander said almost all of the people who get meals donate something toward them, and the remainder comes from a combination of donations from the public and taxpayer money from the federal government.

Our first stop was a house deep inside Del Monte Forest, on a steep hill with an even steeper, crooked driveway. Cespedes has been driving the route for about two years, and expertly maneuvered the truck, executing a tight three-point turn that would have done a DMV examiner proud.

While he jumped out of the truck to take the delivery inside, I perused the comprehensive sheet of instructions Meals on Wheels provided him. In addition to a list of the clients and their food allergies for Cespedes to match with the meals' labels

before dropping off, there's helpful info about how to get into the house if the owner's not home, and words of wisdom like, "Don't let the cats out," or, "Dog will bite."

There's also a map of all the drop-off points, but Cespedes had them memorized. The rest of the route was here in Carmel and Carmel-by-the-Sea, with some beautiful scenery on the way.

"This route isn't for everyone," he said, explaining that the lack of house numbers throws some drivers off. Fortunately, the instructions include fairly detailed descriptions of the charming cottages, along with their names. At the end of each run, that list is shredded to protect participants' privacy.

As we cruised to the second stop, Cespedes told me he found the work rewarding. "You get to know interesting people and their stories," he said. His "regulars" include a retired professor, a woman who still gardens every day even though she's in her 90s, a mountaineer who hiked in the Himalayas and a retired cartoonist and illustrator.

When he came back to the truck after stop No. 2, he had a little bag full of mail. He explained the woman who lived there was having trouble breathing because of the smoke from the Soberanes Fire, so he would drop it off at the post office for her.

At each stop, he spent a few minutes chatting. He assisted a few people with some basic tasks and said that he sometimes helped people sort through their mail, or pulled a few weeds out front of their houses, even though that's not required.

After the last stop, a house off of Rio Road with a neatly manicured lawn, we headed back to the senior center, where he dropped off the

empty containers. Time spent? About two hours, start to finish.


Cespedes hopped in the truck and headed for home. It wasn't fancy, but his tour brought a lot of joy to some people who needed their daily bread.

approached Calder, who had become famous for his abstract mobiles that were hailed by critics as "the most innovative American sculptures of the 20th century."

"It came into being because a racetrack driver had the same passion for racing as he was enthusiastic about contemporary art, and with this idea, he approached us," Girst said in his description of the car. "And the series was born."

Richard Armstrong, of the Guggenheim Museum in New York, said in an interview for BMW that Calder "seems to be a kind of perfect icebreaker for this activity," and Horst Avenarias, senior vice president of corporate affairs for BMW, explained, "His joy in colors matched our joy of driving."

At the start of the project, Poulain had only a small model of the car to offer Calder, who embarked right away on its design. BMW decided to take the risk and invite the artist to put his distinctive touches on that year's 24 Hours of Le Mans racecar, the six-cylinder, 480-horsepower 3.0 CSL that has a top speed of more than 180 mph. The car was one of Calder's final works of art before his death in 1976, and while it failed to finish the famed 24-hour race due to a mechanical problem — and was intended to be a stand-alone project — it ended up spawning a series that so far spans four decades, with more in the works.

Artists Frank Stella, Lichtenstein and Warhol quickly followed, creating their art cars for BMW in the late 1970s, while the 1980s brought cars painted by Ernst Fuchs, Robert Rauschenberg, Michael Jagamara Nelson and Ken Done. In the

1990s, Matazo Kayama, César Manrique, A.R. Penck, Esther Mahlangu, Sandro Chia, David Hockney and Jenny Holzer painted cars, and the new millennium produced BMWs decorated by Olafur Eliasson and Koons, who painted an eight-cylinder 2010 M3 GT2 that produces 500 horse-power and has a top speed of more than 186 mph.

"When one of the most important artists on the planet wants to paint an art car, we just can't say, 'No,'" Girst explained in his discussion of the Koons car. "Thirty-five years after the very first art car was created, the BMW art car series comes full circle with this art car. It races at the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2010, and receives standing ovations at the Goodwood Festival of Speed."

In an interview for BMW, Koons said he was honored "to have the opportunity to make a car

and to participate in this tradition." For inspiration, he rode as a passenger in a racecar, which he described as "like being slammed up against a wall."

"There's a lot of power under that hood," he said.

Koons, who has works hanging in the Guggenheim, the Museum of Modern Art in New York City, the Whitney, and the National Gallery in Washington, D.C., among others, collected images of racecars, related graphics, vibrant colors, speed and explosions while he was developing his ideas for the art car, according to BMW. The design he ended up creating is vibrant, colorful and sleek, and it's described as being "evocative of



power, motion and bursting energy." The car "will impart a dynamic appearance even when it's standing still."

"I'm really very proud of the art car," Koons said in the interview he recorded for the manufacturer. "I think it deals with the really important vitality of life and energy — it's about being up against challenges and forces, and to just keep pushing."

Like the Calder car, the Koons car was driven in the 24 Hours of Le Mans, and like the Calder car, a mechanical problem stopped it from completing the race. They are now on permanent display at BMW's museum in Germany, along with the rest of the collection, but during Concours Week, the two will appear in Pebble Beach for the Concours and at Mazda Raceway for the races.

the definitive tome, "The legendary BMW 507," she figured out by process of elimination what the serial number of Presley's vehicle was.


In 2007, after an article she'd written about the car was published, a reader named Jack Castor called to say he thought he might have it. It was in a warehouse in Pescadero, south of San Francisco, where it had been for decades.

In 2014, when Castor died, it was returned to BMW in Munich for restoration in accordance with his wishes.

When Jouret was asked if she was coming for the unveiling, she replied, "Oh, I'll be there." She added, "I'm looking forward to seeing it again, and I'm really glad it's going to be part of the BMW Museum's collection. That's where it belongs."

It's been under wraps — miraculously, not a single cell phone picture seems to have made it onto the internet — and Concours spokesperson Kandace Hawkinson affirmed, "The [BMW] Museum's not going to let that happen!"



Do a lot of research and you'll find that nothing can replace a hot tip

TOU'VE PROBABLY seen Hot Tip around, maybe at Fifi's Cafe or From Scratch. No, it's not a pooch from Sandy Claws or a kitty from the SPCA. Hot Tip is retired teacher Judy Burdick's 1967 red Mustang. It lives in her garage, next to a little townhome in North Salinas. It's named for its red paint job and its original license plate, which started with "TIP," and has been hanging proudly from its bumper since she got it in 1966.

Burdick, the original owner of the 'Stang, picked it up on Halloween of that year in Monterey, from a salesman named Charlie Brown at Beattie Motors. She still has the sales slip, showing that she paid — eat your heart out — \$3,300 for it.

The Falcon died

She faithfully followed the instructions in the owner's manual — which she also still has — for the "breaking-in period" and maintenance, and nearly 50 years and over 500,000 miles later, Hot Tip is still her one and only ride.

Burdick bought the car when she was 30 and her blue 1960 Ford Falcon died. If you're doing the math, she turned 80 this year and has taken even better care of herself than she has the car. She enjoys frequent walks around her neighborhood, visits to museums and hikes in local parks.

A 40-year veteran of the public schools, Burdick lived in Carmel when she bought the car, but later moved to Salinas where she taught language arts, Spanish and history to fifth graders in Washington Union School District.

Her former students are one of the reasons she's kept the car so long. "They see me when I'm on the road and honk and wave," she said. Besides that, one of them immortalized the car in a tribute at her retirement celebration. She still has it in a scrapbook and read it aloud. The former student — who was by then a teacher himself — wrote that finally, Washington Union had "a cool car" in the parking lot.

"The plain blue Falcon was no more," he said. Burdick remembered how Hot Tip's arrival caused a real buzz among the middle-schoolers.

"'Did you see it?' They kept asking each other," she said.

A card-carrying member

Lest you picture a young, wide-eyed innocent choosing the car based on its sleek lines and candy apple red paint job, Burdick did her homework before buying what's now considered a classic hot rod. She's a card-carrying member of Monterey County Mensa, and applied her considerable brain power to researching her purchase.

"I test-drove V-6s and V-8s, both standard shifts and automatics." She settled on the V-8. "I just liked the power," she said, smiling a little nostalgically. She did, however, decide to go with the automatic transmission. But she never expected the relationship to last this long.

The farthest she's driven it is to her former home in Seattle, with a girlfriend who drove it on the highway for several miles in second gear before Burdick remedied the situation.

The car's needed a little love a few other times, too. Between 1968 and 1980, it was hit on all four corners at one time or another, and after 22 years of faithful service, she had a rebuilt engine installed. And then came the repair jobs from youknow-where.

First, in 2007 she took it to her mechanic at the time, who she said "shall go unnamed." She needed to have some work done on the lower portion

of the Mustang's engine. While Burdick was driving a loaner Buick she'd dubbed "the Blue Beast" that "had good shocks and not much more," the mechanic called to say one of his guys had turned the key to start the car, and a "a bolt flew up through the engine," destroying it.

They hunted around and found another vintage engine, which was dutifully installed.

Then, in 2012, the same mechanic improperly positioned the exhaust pipe during a muffler replacement. Afterward, she smelled some fumes in the passenger compartment. "It was a noxious odor," she remembered. And lucky for her, it was.

Realizing how dangerous the situation was — and having had quite enough of the unnamed mechanic — she knocked on the doors of three neighbors who also had classic Mustangs in their driveways. She quickly located a Salinas mechanic she trusts and has been with him ever since.

'I just quote them \$2 million'

She said it was "about 10 years ago" she began to realize she had a vintage car on her hands. "People compliment me on it all the time," she said. "One guy gave me a thumbs-up through his sunroof as he passed." And, Burdick said, almost everyone smiles when they see it.

The car's not for sale, although she's had many offers. "I just quote them \$2 million," she laughed. "That quiets them up." Burdick's just had too many good miles with Hot Tip to part with it now. "You don't realize it at the time," she said, "but you're really building memories."

She started showing the car three years ago, and in 2014 it won second place in its division at the Vintage Mustang Owners show in San Jose. If you want to meet Burdick and Hot Tip, they'll be at the Pacific Grove Rotary Concours Auto Rally on Fri., Aug. 19 on Lighthouse Ave. in P.G.

For more than 45 years, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Monterey County have been offering young people ages 6 to 18 a safe environment for children. Staff and volunteers with

the nonprofit offer hundreds of children activities and services every day to help them "obtain positive outcomes" related to academic success, good character and healthy lifestyles.

"All activities and services provide for a developmentally rich environment that guarantees all our youth: a safe, positive environment; opportunities to have fun while learning; supportive relationships with caring adults; high expectations; and recognition of their achievements, according to the organization.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Monterey County, at its clubhouses in Seaside and Salinas, serve an average of 800 children a day with "high-quality programs offered by trained youth development professionals."

"Our staff and volunteers serve as trusted mentors and advocates for our youth, offering every child opportunities, expectations, recognition, and guidance in a safe and fun environment," according to BGCMC. "Coupled with a focus on measurable outcomes, our formula for impact puts our mission into action."

According to the organization's 2015 impact report, 35.5 percent of the youth they serve are from ages 6-9; 33 percent are from 10 to 12; and 31.5 percent are ages 13 to 15. And 74 percent of the youth are from lower-income households.

BGCMC's budget was \$4.2 million in 2014-15 and is expected to

grow every year as more sites are opened. Major funding sources include grants, individual donations and bequests, and fundraising events.

United Way Monterey County's mission is to "engage the community and focus resources to improve lives." The group works with local businesses, government and nonprofits to tackle issues in the community from feeding the poor to offering prescription drug discounts.

KeepIt! \$aveIt!," which provides free tax preparation and assetbuilding services to low income individuals and families; a prescription drug discount card lowers the price of eight out of 10 prescriptions for an average savings of 34 percent per

prescription; and Volunteer Opportunities, which helps match local organizations needs with volunteers in the community through various programs and services.

United Way Monterey County's impact to the community is significant.

Last year 14,061 people were connected to services through 2-1-1. The majority of calls were for food and housing assistance. Through the Stuff the Bus program, more than 2,100 homeless students received supplies necessary for the classroom "and returned to school with increased confidence."


